The teaching process, grades and the quality guarantee are compliant with the British educational standards. The students pursue a single course and write a single MA thesis but are awarded two degrees: British and Polish. The curriculum meets the needs and expectations of students from Europe and beyond.

Notably, the teaching team has contributed to various academic publications, including the Journal of Contemporary China, International Journal of Social Research Methodology, Economics & Sociology, Contemporary European History, etc. Their research endeavors extend beyond publications, as they have actively participated in research programmes funded by the Polish Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the European Commission, UACES, and the Polish National Science Centre.

In addition to their academic pursuits, the team brings a wealth of teaching experience, having conducted courses at universities in Austria, the United Kingdom, and the United States.
