- Goethe Certificate C1 or C2 (minimum grade 2)
- telc C1 or C2 (minimum grade 2)

- telc C1 University
 - Language diploma (Level II) of the Standing Conference of the Ministers of Education and Cultural Affairs (KMK), also known as DSD II
 - University entrance qualification examination (Feststellungsprüfung) from a Studienkolleg, section: German

Under the guidance of instructors, you will begin writing, shooting, filming, editing, and producing your first short films, documentaries, music videos, and similar TV and film content early on. You will then choose your individual specialization within the focus areas of directing, cinematography, audio, production, and post-production.

In the 5th semester, you will complete either an internship or a semester abroad.

Depending on your chosen specialization, a wide range of career paths will be open to you after graduation—whether in the film industry, the games and VR sector, as a camera operator, film producer, motion graphics designer, film/TV editor, or sound designer.
